1. What is this product?

Type English law governed equity-linked certificates / Return depends on the performance of the underlyings / No capital protection against market risk

Term The product has a fixed term and will be due on 15 July 2027.

Objectives

(Terms that appear in bold in this section are described in more detail in the table(s) below.)

The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) fixed or conditional coupon payments and (2) a cash payment on the **maturity date**. The amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the **underlyings**. If, at maturity, the **final reference price** of the **worst performing underlying** has fallen to or below its **barrier price**, the product may return less than the **product notional amount** or even zero.

Coupon: On each **coupon payment date** up to and including 14 September 2026 you will receive a coupon payment of EUR 300.00. This coupon payment is not linked to the performance of the **underlyings**. On each **coupon payment date** from and including 15 January 2027 you will receive a conditional coupon payment of EUR 10 together with any previously unpaid coupon payments if the **reference price** of the **worst performing underlying** is at or above its **coupon barrier price** on the immediately preceding **coupon observation date**. If this condition is not met, you will receive no coupon payment on such **coupon payment date**. The relevant dates are shown in the table(s) below.

Termination on the maturity date: On the **maturity date** you will receive:

- if the **final reference price** of the **worst performing underlying** is above its **barrier price**, a cash payment equal to EUR 1,000.00; or
- if the **final reference price** of the **worst performing underlying** is at or below its **barrier price**, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the **worst performing underlying**. The cash payment will equal (i) the **product notional amount** multiplied by (ii) (A) the **final reference price** of the **worst performing underlying** divided by (B) its **strike price**.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlyings**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

When purchasing this product during its lifetime, the purchase price may include accrued coupon on a pro rata basis.

3. What happens if Marex Financial is unable to pay out?

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 1 year

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 15 July 2027 (maturity).

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. Save as otherwise disclosed in exit costs (see section "4. What are the costs?" above), no fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
